### **Quality Learning and Leader Development at The Founders Academy**

What distinguishes The Founders Academy among schools is its Honesty, Transparency, and Comprehensiveness in the development and use of carefully-crafted syllabi and curricula that provide students (and their supportive parents) ALL the information necessary to succeed in their coursework and satisfy the school's Mission by developing into well-educated citizens of character willing and able to become leaders. Our syllabi are posted on our website so that both students and parents have easy access and can use them as a reference and guide anytime throughout the school year.

We encourage you to continue reading and view the exemplary syllabi provided at the end of this document.

Founders Syllabi are works in continuous improvement with the goal of providing our students, parents, and Founders Academy community detailed answers to the following questions:

1.) What will students be learning and what are the learning goals? - subject content, what each student needs to know and demonstrate mastery of at the end of the course.

In addition there is a Round Table syllabus by grade to explore the themes of the school: character, leadership, citizenship and American culture.

- 2.) **How will they be learning the material?** lectures, class discussions, collaborative group work, guided inquiry, guided reading, labs, in- and out-of-class projects, student presentations, mock trials, debates, field trips, science fair projects, entrepreneur activities, etc.
- 3.) How will they be assessed; what is the weighting of assessments and the grade scale? to determine that they are proficient in the subject area and have met the school's mastery requirements-assessments include but are not limited to quarter, mid and end of year tests, quizzes, projects, research papers, web quests, digital portfolios, computer work, music practice cards, recitals, classroom participation, homework, etc.
- 4.) How does the curriculum for that course and level fulfill The Founders Mission? in creating citizens of good character willing and able to take leadership positions in government, technology, industry, science, academia, world affairs and all fields important to mankind.
- 5.) What are the teachers' expectations of students? what materials students will need to bring to class, homework policies, late work policies, makeup work, class behavior, classroom climate, types of assignments that will be provided so that students falling short of mastery have an opportunity to achieve mastery, safety protocols for science labs, appropriate and responsible use of the internet, internet courtesy, plagiarism, academic honesty and integrity, policy for getting extra help from the teacher.
- 6.) What are helpful study and organization tips? and ways to succeed in the coursework.
- 7.) What are the detailed curricula and schedule?- what topics will be covered in sequence with a week by week breakdown. Dates for the end of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th quarters are provided. Important deadlines for major projects are listed, deadlines for field trip permission slips, etc. are listed.

- 8.) **What resources will be used?** Textbook to be used in the course or appropriate online textbook, websites, videos, tutorials, books, other publications, etc.
- 9.) Are there prerequisite courses? required for high school courses
- 10.) **How do I contact the teachers?** Contact Information, availability of teacher through email, phone call, personal visit etc.

Excellent examples of comprehensive syllabi are Mrs. Lopez's Level 1 and Level 2 Math classes, Mrs. Marcotte's Technology classes and Ms. Mote's Level 2 English Classes



On Field Day, Wednesday, June 8, Round Tables will be organized into an Olympic Games with each Round Table being a country with its own flag. ### Final Assessments

Final Assessments are coming up and we want to be sure that students are prepared. Depending on the teacher, the final assessments can be either an exam or project/presentation. A detailed rubric will be provided for a final assessment that isn't an exam.

Final Assessments are scheduled for May 23 - June 3. Subject areas have been assigned specific days in which they will give their assessments so that students do not have too many assessments on one day. The assessment schedule is as follows:

Monday, May 23 - World Language

Tuesday, May 24 - World Language

Wednesday, May 25 - NONE ("Everyday" classes may choose to give part of an exam on this day)

Thursday, May 26 - English/History

Friday, May 27 - NONE

Monday, May 30 - No School (Memorial Day)

Tuesday, May 31 - English/History/Art

Wednesday, June 1 - Computers/Music/Art

Thursday, June 2 - Math/Science

Friday, June 3 - Math/Science/Computers/Art

The daily schedule will run as normal - assessments will be given during a class' normal meeting time. (So if a student has French on Tuesdays/Wednesdays/Fridays at 8:30, they will have their assessment on Tuesday 5/24 at 8:30.) Nightly homework will stop being assigned by teachers on Wednesday 5/25 - unless that homework is for a project/presentation that is part of a Final Assessment grade.

#### NOTES ABOUT THE FINAL ASSESSMENTS:

Those in 9th grade have the privilege of going home early during final assessment week. Parents/guardians may coordinate to pick their students early after 12:45pm (assuming their final assessments are done for that day). If a 9th grader doesn't have final assessments on a day designated as such, he/she may stay home to study (please indicate this absence by emailing attendance@tfanh.org).

To review how final assessments are factored into middle and high school grades, please refer to section 3.2 of the handbook.

Teachers have the discretion to decide whether or not students will be exempt from taking finals in their classes. However, if a teacher determines a student will be exempt, then the reason will be for the following:

- a 3.67 (unweighted) grade point average (or higher) achieved in the current quarter and the immediately preceding quarter.

## Math Tutoring

In preparation for the 7th grade math final exam, the FIRST Lego League coaches and Manchester CHAOS team members are hosting weekly math tutoring sessions Tuesday nights from 7:00 to 8:30, starting May 3rd for 5 weeks. The format will be a mix of concept review, test question review, test taking techniques, real world examples and a game each week. Limited to 12 students at a cost of \$20 per week, for snacks and
